Founded in 1967, the Court Employment Project (CEP) is CASES' flagship program for court-involved youth. Over the past 40 years, CEP and CASES have developed innovative alternatives-to-incarceration that now constitute thirteen programs serving more than 12,000 individuals annually throughout all five boroughs of New York City. Our youth programs work with young people in the Supreme and Family Courts and include gender-specific services for girls, screening and treatment of substance abuse and mental health needs, employment-readiness training and paid community internships, GED preparation and testing on-site, and a transitional high school for youth returning from custodial settings.

ABOUT CAREER EXPLORATION

Founded in 1997, Career Exploration is an award-winning workforce development program serving participants in CASES' youth programs, including the Court Employment Project, GirlRising, and Community Prep High School. The program includes four weeks of employment-readiness classes and eight- to ten-week paid internships at local businesses, government agencies, and non-profit organizations. An active alumni network ensures that Career Exploration graduates continue to pursue their education, develop their job skills, and find employment after leaving CASES.

Career Exploration works with internship providers in dozens of fields—including art, law, education, retail, politics, journalism, construction and technology—to help develop short-term internships where participants will have significant exposure to their fields of interest. While CASES pays 100% of participant stipends, internship providers offer close supervision, mentorship and challenging work assignments. Through partnerships with providers, the program has helped more than 500 young people to take the first steps toward building successful careers and reestablishing their commitment to education.

Support for Career Exploration comes almost entirely from private sources.
